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There are two types of moving estimates or price quotes that can provide moving, mandatory and non-binding estimates. Although non-binding assessments are more common, especially for long-distance crossings, here we are going to decide the mandatory assessment and look at its rules. A mandatory estimate means that the price in the estimate is the amount you pay, even if your cargo weighs more than the estimated amount or less than the estimated amount. Unlike non-binding valuations, a moving company may charge for this service. The following rules come from the Federal Autoway Administration (FMCSA) and must be respected by your relocation company in the preparation and implementation of the mandatory evaluation: a mandatory assessment must accurately describe the shipment and all the services that the company will provide. If you have asked a moving company to provide additional services such as long-term transportation, transfers or flight fees, the company must pay you a separate bill for these costs after your move. At the time of delivery on the day of the move, the moving company cannot charge you more than the mandatory valuation. The mandatory evaluation should be in writing and a copy must be provided to you before moving. Payment must be made at the time of delivery. If you agree with the mandatory valuation, you must pay the amount, decent cash, certified check, cash order or cashier's check, at the time of delivery. Your mover can agree to pay before moving, extend the loan or accept a credit card. It's up to the moving company. If you can't pay the mover after delivery, the company will place your belongings in storage until you can pay the mandatory valuation. Storage fees are your responsibility and you will pay. Your engine should keep a copy of the mandatory score and attach it to the lading account. The moving company should clearly know that the valuation is mandatory for you and your mover. Each mandatory assessment should also clearly state that only the services set out in the estimate are charged. Before loading your home goods, if a moving company believes that you have additional items not specified in the estimate, the loader may refuse to service you. Make sure all you need to move is clearly laid out in the estimate. If you need to add items, tell your loader so you can work out an agreement before they start loading your cargo. Once the moving company agrees to move your items, they must either confirm the mandatory valuation, agree on a revised written mandatory valuation, listing additional items or services, or add an investment to the contract in writing, stating that you will both consider the initial mandatory assessment as an optional assessment. Again, avoid any supplements if you can. can lead to a higher price move and can result in not having to move on a moving day. Once your cargo loads all your household items, they have agreed to a mandatory estimate and no changes can be made or additional costs costs except for agreed additional services and fees. As indicated earlier, these additional costs should be billed after the delivery of the goods. Only a mandatory estimate can be charged when delivered. The best option for all mandatory and non-binding assessments is a mandatory non-to-excess assessment. This means that if the actual weight of your cargo is greater than the written estimate, you will still pay the specified amount. However, if the actual weight is less than the written estimate, you pay a smaller amount. If you ask for a mandatory estimate that does not exceed the cost, you will never pay a higher price than what is on the estimate. Your price can only go lower. Let's say you have a 24-page book that you want to print. In order to add up the pages, you'll print pages 1-2 and 23-34 on a single page, so you need to have the total number of pages divided into four (you can stuff blank pages in the back if necessary).
